Continuous ticketing innovation

Following the success of the 2012 eTicketing conference, UIC and CIT are pleased to announce the repeat event for 2013. Railways continue to respond to customer demands and developments in technology by offering new and innovative eTicketing services. The 2013 event will provide UIC and CIT members with details about developments in the sector and will provide them with the opportunity to influence sector policies in ticketing innovation.

Smart solutions

As for last year, the event will combine presentations from the railway world together with participation in challenging workshops. The formal programme will run from 13:30 on Tuesday 1 October, finishing at 15:30 the next day. The hosts are Dutch Railways NS, who have kindly provided the UIC and CIT with the conference facilities at their Utrecht headquarters.



NS is one of a growing set of UIC members that is making a significant move of their ticketing business to smart cards. This industry transformation will form the basis for the first day's presentations. NFC is also a subject of much interest, despite its later than expected arrival in the mass market, and this will also be covered in day one.

Back office challenges

Day two will address the back office, legal and operational issues that a move to eTicketing means for a railway. UIC members are developing their own experiences with these subjects and the conference will provide a chance to hear and learn from colleagues who have similar challenges.

The UIC/CIT eTicketing conference will be useful for everyone working on this topic within their railway. We look forward to seeing you in the autumn at Utrecht.

How do I get there?

Utrecht is easy to reach from Amsterdam International Airport Schiphol (IATA Code: AMS). There are direct trains approx. every 15 minutes. Journey time to Utrecht Centraal is 32 minutes.

Please note that you must hold a ticket before boarding the train. There is in general no on-board sale of train tickets in The Netherlands.

Once arrived at Utrecht Centraal, go upstairs to "Hoog Catharijne" and leave the building at the Southern bus station ("*Busstation Zuid*"). Behind the bus station, you can already see the NS Headquarters building. The footwalk from the platform to the building should not take longer than 10 minutes.

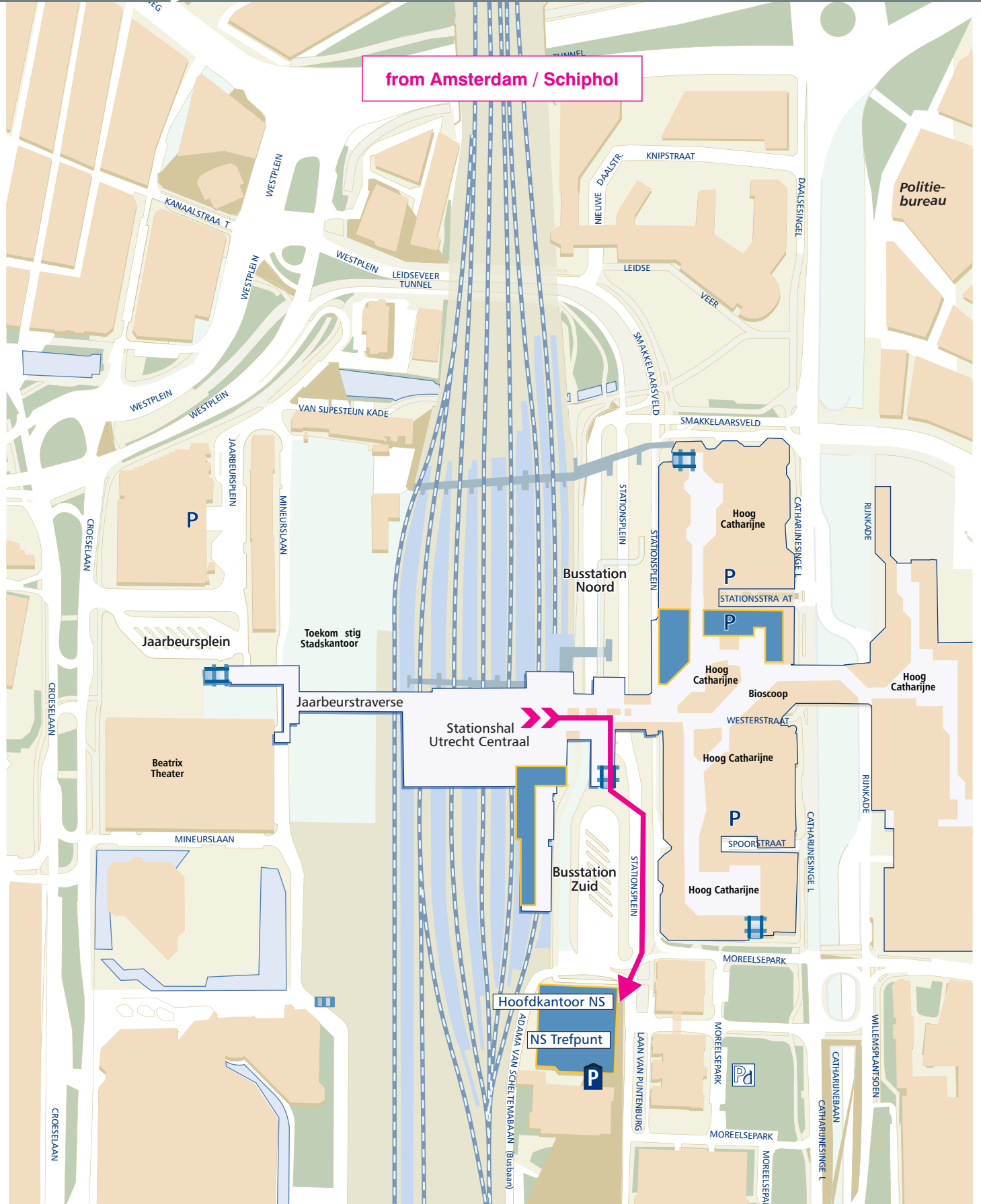
